Introduction

This Southern Nevada Youth Resource Guide was created by and for youth (ages 12-24). This tool provides information on organizations that provide services to youth still with their families, as well as youth that are out of school or on their own.

Southern Nevada youth under the age of 18 in need of housing solutions must seek services at

- (1) Nevada Partnership for Homeless Youth, or
- (2) St. Jude's Ranch.

PLEASE NOTE (1/2): *If a young Nevadan under the age of 18 seeks services at an agency other than one of the three listed above, that organization is required to contact Child Protective Services.*

PLEASE NOTE (2/2): *Some of these services also provide housing for those over 18, so please review the details we've presented carefully, and don't skip this section due to any age assumptions.*

St. Jude's Ranch provides transitional living services for youth (ages 15-18) and housing services for young adults (ages 18-24). Clients receive wrap-around support services and case management, as well as safe housing, education counseling, and access to therapy, job training, transportation, support services, and an individualized plan for independence.

Admission to housing programs requires applicants to complete a housing assessment first.

NPHY Serves youth (ages 12-20) and offers many services for youth who are housing insecure. The organization offers coordinated intake for youth under 18. (The intake process takes an hour).

Their Drop-In Center provides access to food, clothing, hygiene supplies, showers, emergency shelter, and bus passes (with proof of activity for school or a job), assistance with identification documents, and help with school and work.

HOUSING II

For Youth 18 Years and Older

Young adults in Southern Nevada that have reached the age of 18 have less restricted options for shelter and temporary housing providers.

Since many of these options are open to all ages, it may be difficult to find agencies that both provide shelter and have enough available to offer to all those in need.

Therefore, young adults seeking shelter may want to contact the following agencies before simply seeking shelter with them, to ask about what their requirements might be, what time they allow people to line-up for emergency housing, and other information that might prevent them from trekking across town only to be denied a much-needed service.

*All of these agencies want to help,
but they have a limited amount of staff
and even fewer resources.*

If they can help you, they will.

*Find out what they need from you first:
it will be well worth the extra effort.*

Catholic Charities provides emergency night shelter (400 beds) to young adult men (18 years and older). Linens, showers, and restroom facilities are available.

Guests must arrive by 3:00 pm daily for a bed and must leave by 7:00 am the next day. They must show an ID or obtain a Clarity Card on site.

Catholic Charities also offer apartments for individuals (18 years and older) if they maintain a minimum income of \$1,100 a/month.

Young people ages 12 to 21 who need immediate safety can walk in and ask for a “Safe Place” at any of the locations listed below. Trained staff will ensure they get help right away. This support is available through Nevada’s participation in the national SAFE PLACE program.

HOUSING III

Rental & mortgage assistance, utility assistance, housing supplies, and more for young adults & families

Emergency sheltering isn't the only option that's available for young Nevadans in need of support.

Sometimes you've already got a roof over your head, but you still need help getting stable, or assistance *keeping* that safe place you can call your own. Nonprofits can help in these situations.

Help might take the shape of paying one month's rent to stave off an eviction, or covering half of an electric bill. It might be providing a bed to an empty home. It could be connecting you with a volunteer to repair something important.

As you can imagine, there's a lot of demand for this kind of help. The nonprofits work hard to serve as many people as they can - that's why they exist! Still, they may or may not be able to help you by the time you connect with them, and it's why some have certain eligibility conditions.

Keep that in mind as you reach out - plan for the worst, but hope for the best as you contact them, and understand that they *want* to help you, it's just a matter of determining if they can do it.

Family Promise's Day Center (which is open by appointment only) offers job search guidance, childcare referrals, bus passes, and assistance with emergency support needs (including first month's rent in some circumstances).

They may also be able to provide emergency housing for families with children, including youth. Families with minor children. That can include being placed in their Motel Shelter program if the family is currently homeless and lacks financial stability.

They also work with properties who may rent to formerly convicted individuals.

CONSUMABLE NEEDS

Immediate Meals, Food Pantries / Free Groceries, Diapers, Blankets, Toiletries, & More.

While this guide was being researched, information about *Clarity ID*'s came up more during food-related services than during any other topic, so we'll explain them here.

Clarity ID's are a type of identification that make accessing lots of services in Nevada much easier to do, but especially when it comes to food.

Essentially, there's only so much to go around, so they help nonprofits and other types of charities know who's been served, and who actually needs service.

With Clarity ID's, if an organization has a 'once a week' rule for their meal program or food-pantry visits, they can make sure no one is 'cutting the line' or taking someone else's share.

Many of the services listed in this section won't just require Clarity ID's... they can help you get one if you don't have it yet.

To get one, you'll visit any participating agency in-person, bring valid photo ID (e.g., state ID, driver's license, school ID like you'd normally use for services, and then just ask staff directly for a Clarity ID.

Catholic Charities offers a number of food services. Their Hands of Hope food pantry is a place where youth can get food to take with them, providing access to their food pantry once every 30 days.

For the pantry, a government issued ID and proof of residence with name and address dated within 30 days of visit (rent receipt, utility bill, etc.) is needed. They're open Mon-Fri, 8am-2pm, and the *last* Saturday of each month from 8am-12pm.

They also serve meals at 10 am daily in a safe setting. Youth under 18 may be connected to a case manager for additional services.

For meals, you must have a Clarity ID. Clients without Clarity ID can contact Catholic Charities for assistance getting one.

Most CPCs exist to prevent abortions at all costs and are criticized for looking like real clinics, offering limited services, and for misrepresenting information about abortion safety and other reproductive healthcare services.

When you're already facing challenging circumstances, having to deal with matters of personal violence can seem unthinkable.

Unfortunately, statistics suggest many of the youth that pick up this guide will need the resources listed on the next few pages at some point during their lives.

When it comes to relationship violence, at least 1 in 7 men, 1 in 4 women, and 1 in 3 non-cis people will be victims of it at some point during their lives.

While relationship violence reaches all walks of life, it does tend to have a tendency to escalate more quickly among those in difficult and high-stress situations (like when you're with a partner seeking housing, or low on supplies).

We urge you: if you unfortunately end up having an experience that one of these agencies can help you with, or a person they can keep you safe from, please contact them and get their help.

If you're in survival mode, or just worried about getting through the next few weeks, we understand that school might not feel like a top priority right now—especially if you're skimming this guide for help with more urgent needs.

But this section isn't just about earning a diploma—though we do encourage you to stay focused and “get the piece of paper.” A high school diploma (or a GED) opens far more doors than trying to get by without one. 
